

# NATO Engages: The Brussels Summit Dialogue

11.-12. July 2018

On July 11-12, the world will watch as heads-of-state and government, military leaders, and senior officials gather at the 2018 NATO Summit in Brussels. Working as a consortium and in partnership with NATO, the Atlantic Council, German Marshall Fund (GMF), Munich Security Conference (MSC), and Women in International Security Brussels (WIIIS), will organize the official high-profile outreach event of the NATO Summit, NATO Engages: The Brussels Summit Dialogue.

Featuring a diverse array of experts and leaders from around the world and across a range of sectors, the consortium's event will be one of the most significant gatherings of international security leaders in 2018. Amongst others we will welcome Jens Stoltenberg, Secretary General of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, Petro Poroshenko, President of Ukraine, Beatrice Fihn, Executive Director, ICAN, Katrín Jakobsdóttir, Prime Minister of Iceland and Rose Gottemoeller, Deputy Secretary General, North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

NATO Engages: The Brussels Summit Dialogue will take place inside the security perimeter next to the new NATO Headquarters. The close proximity to the Summit will provide unparalleled opportunities to host attending dignitaries and world leaders on the event's main stage. As the sole public event at the Summit, the outreach event will fuse the consortium's cumulative resources around a single platform for maximum impact and visibility.

The event will take on the most pressing challenges facing the NATO alliance in an effort to share insights and perspectives, problem-solve, generate new ideas, and help translate these into policy-relevant recommendations. Key themes for the discussion will include top items on the official Summit agenda, as well as broader transatlantic and global security issues. Some of these include: conventional defence and deterrence; counterterrorism; projecting stability; burden-sharing; NATO-Russia relations; NATO-EU cooperation; hybrid threats; cyber defence and security; Alliance adaptation, and more.
